LUKE CHAPTERS 9-13

OCTOBER 18, 2020

READ

- Luke's gospel from 4:14-9:50 now focuses on the period of popularity for the Lord Jesus, when He ministered in and around the region of Galilee.
- Read Luke 9:46-50 and consider what lesson the Holy Spirit intends us to learn.

EXAMINE

- With today's passage we reach the end of the Lord's popular appeal around Galilee. As we saw last week, when it seemed like the Lord was poised to ascend the throne in Jerusalem (9:28-36) and when His disciples were ready to support Him (9:18-20), we saw that the disciples were not ready and were still lacking in key areas. Review: where did you see last week areas of deficiency in the disciples' character?
- Looking at 9:46-50 we see Jesus dealing with two additional problem areas in the character of His disciples. How would you summarize those two problems?
- Jesus uses the example of a child to illustrate humility (9:46-48). How does a child help serve as a good example of humility for disciples?
- John sees someone outside of the disciple group performing miracles in Jesus's name. What counsel does Jesus give to correct John?

APPLY

- Like the first disciples of Jesus we who follow Him today entertain thoughts of our individual greatness and importance. What do believers today tend to argue about in relation to their "greatness"? How do you sometimes struggle in this area?
- Read 1 Corinthians 1:26-31. What do you learn in this passage about yourself? How does this passage equip you to think more humbly about yourself?
