

The King's Calling

The Gospel of Luke Chapters 15-19

OCTOBER 3, 2021

READ

- Luke's gospel from 9:51-19:44 begins with Jesus determined to go to Jerusalem and culminates with His triumphal entry to the city. This section could be summarized as "the Road to the Cross."
- Read Luke 18:31-43 and consider what lesson the Holy Spirit intends us to learn.

EXAMINE

- In verse 31 Jesus refers to the things written about the Son of Man. What writings is he referring to (be specific)?
- In verse 31, we are told that Jesus spoke directly to the twelve; however, in verse 34 we see that things were "hidden" and "not grasped" by them. What was the purpose of Jesus message in light of these facts?
- How does the blind man refer to Jesus and what does this tell us about the blind man?
- How does verse 39 compare to verse 15?
- Looking at the entirety of chapter 18, what conclusions can we draw about Jesus teaching for the disciples?

APPLY

- How do we seek to understand the hard things about God?
- In what ways can we act like the blind man in this passage?
- In what ways can we act like the crowd in verse 39?
- What do these passages demonstrate about the importance of the Old Testament?
- How do these passages affirm Jesus and His mission on earth? (Luke 4:18)

PRAY

- Adore the Lord for who He is. One who gives sight to the blind.
- Confess weak areas (blindness) in your walk with Jesus and seek forgiveness from Jesus.
- Express thankfulness to God for His Son as the prophesied and fulfilled Savior.
- Ask the Lord for His will to be made clear for your life.
