



THE KING'S CONFIRMATION

Luke Chapters 20-22

READ

- Luke has taken us on a journey with Jesus to Jerusalem and shown us a great deal about who he is, bringing Him closer to his greatest trial and many confrontations. We are here with his disciples, observing all that is happening.
- Read Luke 20:9-26 and consider what lesson the Holy Spirit intends us to learn.

EXAMINE

- In verses 9-16, who are the planter (vineyard owner), tenants, servants, and the beloved son?
- What does the vineyard and fruit from the vineyard represent in this parable (9-10)?
- Read at Luke 19:47-48. In light of this, why does Jesus share this parable? (see also Luke 20:19)
- Looking at Isaiah 8:14-15, what is Jesus trying to communicate to the people?
- In verses 19-26, what is the plan against Jesus and what is the result?

APPLY

- In what ways can we be similar to the tenants (trying to keep the vineyard for ourselves)?
- How have you changed the rules to meet your own goals or withheld details for personal gain?
- If Jesus is gracious to those who wish to destroy Him, how are we to treat those who oppose us?

PRAY

- Thank the Lord that His love is gracious to those who are opposed to Him.
- Thank the Lord that His knowledge is greater than humanity's knowledge.
- Confess areas where you have fallen short in your view of the Lord.
- Express thankfulness for God's mercy and grace in forgiving your sins.
- Pray for boldness to lovingly share the good news of Jesus to others.
