



THE KING'S CONFIRMATION

Luke Chapters 20-22

READ

- In Luke 21:5-28, Jesus is prophesying of the Temple's destruction, Jerusalem's destruction and the Coming of the Son of Man. This week concludes this lesson from Jesus.
- Read Luke 21:29-38 and consider what lesson the Holy Spirit intends us to learn.

EXAMINE

- Examine first the context of this passage. Jesus refers to "these things taking place" in verse 31. To what does "these things taking place" refer? See Luke 21:20-24 and 25-28.
- To what natural event does Jesus point his disciples to help them anticipate "the kingdom of God is near" (29-31)?
- Jesus claims that "this generation" will not die until they witnessed "all has taken place" (32). What group of people does Jesus refer to as "this generation"?
- How does Jesus assert His authority on these matters in verse 33?
- What positive steps must believers take in light of the Son of Man's return (34-36)?
- What negative things must believers avoid in light of the Son of Man's return (34-36)?

APPLY

- Do you in everyday life think about the return of the Lord Jesus to this earth? If yes, what helps you to remember and think on Him? If no, what things might stand in the way of doing so?
- Often our prayer lives can routinely focus on the same things. Jesus directs us to pray specifically about the end times. What requests can you incorporate into your prayer time today that seek to apply Luke 21:34-36?
