



THE KING'S EXALTATION

Luke Chapters 23-24

READ

- Read Luke 24:13-35 and consider what lesson the Holy Spirit intends us to learn.

EXAMINE

- Luke introduces us to two people in verse 13. Who are they, and what do you learn about them throughout this passage?
- Another person joins them as they travel, and we are told that it is Jesus Himself! But why do the two travelers not recognize Him (15-16)?
- Jesus draws out through questions the thoughts these two had about Him (17-19). What things did they report about Jesus (19-24)?
- How does Jesus diagnose these two and their perspective on Him (25)? How does Jesus help them (26-27)?
- This account wraps up in a home over, once again in Luke's record, a shared meal. How does Jesus reveal Himself at last to them (28-31)?
- In the end, what do the travelers say to each other (32), and what do they immediately go and do (33-35)?

APPLY

- "What things?" (24:19) is a question that reveals the great patience of our Lord! Do you often think of the Lord as patient with you? He knows all things yet wants us to share our thoughts with Him. How should this truth encourage your times in prayer?
- "Slow of heart to believe" (25) describes disciples on that day and in our day. Christ-centered reading, study, and preaching of the Bible causes slow hearts to burn! What are some Old Testament stories you know that point us to something about the Lord Jesus?
- "The Lord has risen indeed" (34) is truly exciting news and motivates disciples to run miles to share with others. Who can you share this good news with this week?

PRAY

- Take time to write out below a prayer of praise, confession of sins, and/or requests based on this passage.
